



State of Association: Membership Trends 2010-2015





Through August, cumulative 2015 income is strong due to robust CEBoK and Certification professional development activity, while expenses reflect a tight rein on international office staffing hours. We expect to exceed the net positive number projected in the 2015 budget.

Q & A: Dues Increase

What did the increase in dues really accomplish?

- ICEAA (SCEA/ISPA) dues unchanged since 1987
 - Rate did not reflect increased benefits or even inflation
 - Membership was sold at a loss
 - Dues remain low vs. comparable organizations
- The continued financial health of the organization required the increase
 - ICEAA had been running significant budget deficit for years
 - New initiatives, like those suggested for this meeting, come with significant cost



Q & A: Membership and Chapter Participation

Activity in our chapter has been dropping. How can we increase this?

- Pinpoint when it started
- What was working when it worked?
 - If previous success was the result of an outside influence that you cannot duplicate, look for ways to capitalize on what you are able to recreate
 - If simply repeating what worked before isn't working now, it's time to change tactics
 - Ask members why they stopped participating and what would get them back
 - Reach out to other chapter leaders (emails on ICEAA website) for their ideas
- Be prepared to try and try again



Q & A: Industry & Government Relations

We would be much more interested in agendas that seek to build relationships between industry and government customers, providing platforms for open dialogues and building common understanding and helping address some of the inefficiencies built into the way we do business today.

Q & A: ICEAA Leadership Diversity

The composition of the Board of Directors does not reflect the changing trends in the organization's membership. Is there a plan or a process to develop a succession plan for the Board of Directors, which includes reaching out beyond the traditional membership base?

- Agree the board has limited representation from government, women, younger members, and minority groups
- Entry point for future board is through committee participation and chapter leadership
- Actively recruiting more diverse committee members
- Chapters too need to recruit more diversely
- Get involved!



Q & A: Software Certification

What is the status of the Software CEBoK certification that Nesma and ICEAA are working on? Is the Common Software Measurement International Consortium (COSMIC) also involved in this initiative?

- Have formed steering committee, finalizing charter
- Cooperative effort between ICEAA, Nesma, and IFPUG
- Curriculum will encompass all industry standard software estimation models and accepted methods, including COSMIC, IFPUG function point, lines of codes, use cases, and story points



Q & A: Online Forums

Can ICEAA create an online forum for discussion and exchange of ideas -- requests on an everyday basis for both business and social interaction?

Can ICEAA develop a database of projects done by members, which could be a vital source of information for future generations of estimators? Could be subscription based.

- No current plans for creating the infrastructure for these, but willing to explore collaboration with existing forums/systems
- In the meantime, we recommend using the ICEAA Facebook and LinkedIn pages



Q & A: Training

Will there be more virtual training opportunities?

What is ICEAA doing, like this virtual meeting, to accommodate the lack of government travel funds?

- We've experimented with Webinars; expect more in future, but content is member driven
- Board has discussed engaging in virtual training utilizing CEBoK and/or Workshop materials
- Presents issues of cannibalizing our workshops, eroding revenue, and cost of managing
- · Nothing planned, but open to limited experiments at this point



Q & A: Special Interest Groups

How can I start a group (Special Interest Group) within ICEAA that focuses on life sciences/biotech/nanotechnology cost estimating and issues?

- ICEAA instituted the concept of Special Interest Groups (SIGs) in 2014
- SIGs are driven by groups of ICEAA members with the interest and desire to advance the profession in a specific area
- Anyone can start a SIG, but there are rules and must be approved by Board of Directors
- ICEAA provides some infrastructure support, but the members make it succeed
